#### **Community Centre Roof**

I am sure that you are aware that we need a new roof over the whole of the Community Centre. The current roof is leaking in several places, in the Main Hall, and the floor has suffered water damage. The cost of a new roof is expensive, which is why this cannot happen until the next Financial Year April 2024 - March 2025. We have received approval for a temporary metal sheet covering over part of the Hall and I am hopeful that this will commence in January. I know the metal sheeting will not look pretty, but I hope you will understand that we have to prevent the water damaging any more of the building.

We are all fully aware that we are in a Conservation Area, and the new roof will be tiled, but with a different tile to the current roof

#### **Village Events**

#### **Post Office**

I also hope that this is the year that both the lonely, and those who need help find Neighbourhood Watch can bring them some comfort.

#### **Scams**

The Christmas period has seen a big increase in the number of scams, and unfortunately in the number of people who have been caught out, and suffered loss. How to safeguard yourself - If the scam is in written form (any email or letter), do check very carefully the wording. There are often spelling mistakes, or minor errors in the addresses, one digit wrong in the postcode. If you feel that you need to check further don't use the suspect email to do this, contact the company via your own address book, letter or bill heading. When you are satisfied this is a scam please report it. If you receive a telephone message, that raises your concerns, take your time, do not allow yourself to make a hasty decision, tell them to ring back the next day to give you time to think, and follow it up.

#### Royal Mail

Current there is a scam circulating using the 'Royal Mail' name. Unless you are already dealing with the Royal Mail on a personal matter, I would advise you ignore any emails bearing their name.

#### **Street Coordinators**

Would you consider becoming a Street Coordinator with Neighbourhood Watch. We have areas of our village without someone who can maintain contact with the NWM in your street. A monthly NHW Newsletter is produced, and sent via email to all Street Coordinators, who can then pass the information on to their members, generally by simply sending the email forward. Help can be given to increase the number of members in your location.

Remember NHW is free to join, no annual subscriptions, or monthly fees.

The array of Christmas jumpers made the judging difficult, so the winner was decided by audience applause (and cheering).



# Eye Youth Centre and Library PCC Review for Closure

Eye Village residents were extremely concerned to hear last November that Peterborough City Council is even considering the closure and sale of its Youth Centre and Library building.

The Old Girls School a Historic building in Eye Conservation Area has Article 4 protection for its outside structure; it has been used as a Youth Centre and Library for 61 years following a new school being built in the 1960's due to the growth in the village.

After finding out about the review of the building Dale McKean and Lilian Muxlow started a petition to save the building and for the Eye Senior Youth Club that was closed 5 years ago to be re started by the City Council given the significant government grants that have been made available with a deadline of 2025.

Within a week the petition had 673 signatures these were handed into Peterborough City Council by Dale and Lilian on Wed 15th Nov these were checked and the verified number was 648 which meets the threshold to discuss at Full Council Meeting.



Our MP Paul Bristow had already signed the Petition and called for a meeting outside the Youth Centre and Library on Friday 17th Nov, some great comments and discussion was held giving the Council Officers and Councillor present a much better understanding of the importance of the Youth Centre and Library to Eye village residents.

On the 20th December Dale and Lilian met with The Council Leader Cllr Farooq and Deputy Leader and Cabinet Member for Corporate Governance and Finance Cllr Howard, they handed over the additional Petition signatures collected, this brought the total to 1,517 objections. They also raised the many concerns about the potential closure.

Thank you to all that helped with signature collection for the petition to keep Eye Youth Centre and Library building open and to get the Senior Youth Club re started.

On the 2nd January Dale and Lilian took the Council Officers and Deputy Leader around the Youth Centre and also Manor Farm Community Centre pointing out the current facilities and Issues of the potential closure and relocation.

# Eye Youth Centre and Library PCC Review for Closure

We have been assured that no decision has been made and there is much to review, they will be consulting and working with the users going forward. The next steps are

- Dale McKean formally presented the Petition at the Full Peterborough City Council Meeting on the 24th January 2024 and following a 40 minute debate is was agreed that it would go forward to the Cabinet Meeting in Feb 24.
- The Asset review recommendations (Including Eye) will be going to the PCC Scrutiny Meeting on 30th Jan.
- Then PCC Cabinet on 12th Feb.

Council Meeting on the 21st Feb 24 for discussion.

By Next Eyescan we should know a lot more, any news before then will be put onto the 2 Village Facebook pages.



Lilian Muxlow who has been working with the Youth in Eye Village for over 40 years and has been running the Junior Youth Club on a voluntary basis for the last 18 years, said. I have been contacted by so many previous youth members saying how important the Youth Club was for them and how much they enjoyed it and so many now have their children going and how much fun they have'.







#### Eye Santa Sleigh 2023

Elliott's Army are also aiming to build a park area in the village in memory of Elliott. The team are hoping that they can get supported funding for this, but if not, then they will also aim to start fundraising for this under Elliott's specially named fund. We wish them every success with this journey and keeping our fingers crossed that the memorial park will go ahead successfully.

In August I was approached by Keely Mills of Peterborough Presents and asked if I would be interested in leading a Photoshoot of Eye resident's dogs

accommodating in our request to use

their paddock/exercise field for the photoshoot.









### **Eye Green Nature Reserve**

You may have seen Froglife wardens out and about on Tuesdays working on the reserve. Currently we are focusing on restoring some of the finger ponds that are in the north of the reserve. This restoration will benefit the protected Great Crested Newts that live on the reserve. These wonderful creatures spend most of their lives terrestrially (on land) however need ponds to breed, lay their eggs and once hatched the larvae live in water until large enough to absorb their gills and make their way onto land.

The restorations we are doing involve removing vegetation around the finger

ponds as they need light to ensure oxygenating plants can grow and this increases the health of the water and what can live in it. Please avoid letting your dogs jump in these ponds as these protected species are delicate creatures and too much activity can lead to newts abandoning that pond to breed in.

Any "spot on" tick or flea treatments can

also harm the insect population of the pond which disturbs the ecosystem of that pond and a food source for amphibians.

We have also been restoring the "Bowling Green" area. This grassy field was overgrown with scrub and brambles, but we are almost there with clearing this to create a wildflower meadow to support pollinators and other invertebrates which are the food for amphibians and reptiles as well as providing suitable shelter for them. This has taken longer than anticipated as we keep finding Toads out and about in the grass due to the warm autumn and having to use hand tools to keep them safe. Part of the meadow we will sow wildflower seeds and other parts we will continue to mow and remove scrub until the wildflower seeds already in the soil will start to regenerate. This usually takes a few years to establish however with the sown seeds we should see a wonderful display of blooms this summer.

A big thank you to our volunteers who come out in all weather to maintain their local reserve. If this is something you would like to do, we have volunteer days on Tuesdays between 10am and 3pm however any time that you can give is gratefully received. # Save Eye Library and Youth Club

I was saddened at the recent news that the Eye Youth Centre and Library was among the list of 79 Peterborough City Council Assets that could potentially be sold.

When I went to visit the Centre, I heard how Lillian -

who runs the youth club, had been working with the young people in Eye Village for more than 40 years and has been running the Junior Youth Club on a voluntary basis for 18 years!

The campaign to save this much loved youth club and library started last year when local man Dale McKean set up a petition. I signed the this back in November and which got over a thousand signatures!

I am backing this campaign 100%. I think the Council will eventually back down, it will be cheaper and easier for everyone if they did this now rather than later.

There was a big show of support for this campaign back in November when I joined residents in Eye as they came out to show their outside the centre.

Youth clubs offer an opportunity for young people to get together, make new friends and socialise.

It often gives children and teenagers a sense of belonging in their community, providing a safe space for them to learn and keep out of mischief.

This venue is crucial for these services to carry on being provided in Eye.

I won't stop campaigning for the Eye Youth Centre to be taken off the list of assets that could potentially be sold, it is important to young people and families in this village and has my full support.



# **Business spotlight.....**

# **Pioneer Caravans**

Pioneer Caravans is a well known family business with over 80 years experience. Based in Thorney Road, Eye Pioneer was the brainchild of Ernest and May Allison, great-grandparents of the present family who ran a transport company in the 1940's with their two sons Ted and Les. This began the family legacy towards the company that you see today, firstly, by opening a residential park on the Thorney Road site. The Park still exists today, located behind the centre at Eye, where up to 100 homes are permanently occupied by their owners with a mixture of retired and young families, some of which have lived on the park for over 40 years and seen many coming and goings.

Positioned on the main A47 the site also had a busy petrol station which serviced the community and many local characters from the village. The old canopy remains and has become a landmark, in the early nineties the Eye bypass was constructed and the difficult decision was made to close the petrol station after fifty years due to the lack of passing trade.

The land was later bought by Ted Allison's son-in-law John Norris who, with his wife Thelma, ventured into caravan sales and were joined in the following years by their children to help run the growing business and is still run by the family today.
